Option #1 on Page 1: "Basic Needs of Living Things" Brainstorming Chart – Create a chart with one heading and two columns (or use the empty chart below on page 1) on your Elmo, white board or flipchart, and then ask the students to brainstorm to help you fill in the chart. Help the students look for patterns as evidence in their answers and discuss how they fit in a broad list of needs (example at bottom of page 1).

Option #2 on Page 2: "Basic Needs of Living Things" Checklist - Put the chart on page 2 on the Elmo or whiteboard and read the informational text together with your students. Help the students look for patterns.
